

Expect J. L. Thomas To Recover From Injuries Sustained When Car Is Struck By Erie Train

Glass Works Official Suffered Bruises and Lacerations In Accident On Walnut Street Crossing This Morning; Condition Is Reported "Favorable" Today; Was Attempting to Drive Car From Railroad Tracks

With X-rays revealing no broken bones, John L. Thomas, secretary and treasurer of Corning Glass Works, was reported today in "favorable" condition following an accident at 1:10 a. m. this morning when the Thomas' car was struck by an east-bound Erie passenger train on Walnut street.

Dr. E. B. McAndrew, surgeon-in-chief, said this morning that Mr. Thomas suffered lacerations about the face and a severe scratch along the back of the scalp. A physician confirmed this and also said that Mr. Thomas was unconscious for several hours after the crash.

Mr. Thomas, with other executives of Corning Glass Works, had been attending a glass work meeting at the Glass Works. It was reported that he stopped at the driver's shop of the Barco Electric Hotel, and was en route home from there when his car was struck by the train.

John H. Thomas, the injured man's son, was a passenger on the train. He got out at the Corning station and went home without knowing that his father had been struck by the train.

There is a Glass Works executive motored south on Walnut street and made a left-hand turn down the south side of Erie avenue. The left wheel of the vehicle left the roadway and ran on part of the Erie track, witnesses said.

In an attempt to drive off the track, Mr. Thomas' car hit the engine and apparently did not see until approaching the crossing to the story filed to Officer William Jones of the Corning police by Edward B. Peterson, of Cleveland, Ohio, an eye witness to the accident. Mr. Peterson is employed as a labor foreman in the new shipping building now under construction by Corning Glass Works.

Several persons who were attracted to the accident, reported that Mr. Thomas was attempting to remove his car from the track, was approaching and attempting to flag it. Falling in their efforts.
